Re-Opening Swimming Pools After a Pandemic

Many states have started reopening public pools and you have probably been working closely with your local public health officials on your plan for reopening your pool as well. Great American has collected information from the Centers for Disease Control to create a simplified checklist to help in managing safety risks as you reopen.

Reopening Swimming Pools Checklist*	Yes	No	
Is signage posted for all staff, patrons and swimmers to wash their hands often and cover their nose and mouth when they sneeze or cough?			
Are additional signs posted about how to prevent the spread of Covid-19?			
Are cloth face coverings provided or required when social distancing is difficult?			
Is the organization educating the staff, patrons, and swimmers about when to stay home?			
Does the organization make sure staff and patrons have access to adequate healthy hygiene products?			
Does the organization broadcast regular announcements over the PA?			
Are frequently touched surfaces cleaned and disinfected at least daily?			
Are shared objects cleaned and disinfected after each use?			
Are the companies or engineers that designed the equipment contacted when deciding what type of disinfectant to use?			
Are the ventilation systems of indoor spaces operating properly?			
Is there increased introduction of outdoor air as much as possible?			
Are all water systems safe to use after a facility shutdown?			
Are standing and sitting spaces modified so that people can remain 6 feet away from each other?			
Are there physical or visual cues to ensure that the staff, patrons, and swimmers stay 6 feet away from each other?			
Is there adequate equipment for patrons and swimmers to minimize sharing as much as possible?			
Are the companies or engineers that designed the equipment contacted before altering aquatic features?			
Are modified job responsibilities available for vulnerable employees?			
Is the aquatic venue limited to only staff, patrons, and swimmers who live in the local area?			
Is there a specific staff member assigned to monitoring handwashing, use of face coverings, and social distancing?			
Are the shifts of the staff members staggered to reduce the amount of staff present at one time?			
Are there sick leave policies and practices for staff that are flexible and non-punitive?			
Is there a back-up staffing plan in place?			
Is the staff trained on all safety protocols?			
Is social distancing used in the staff's training sessions?			
Are daily health checks conducted on the staff?	П	П
